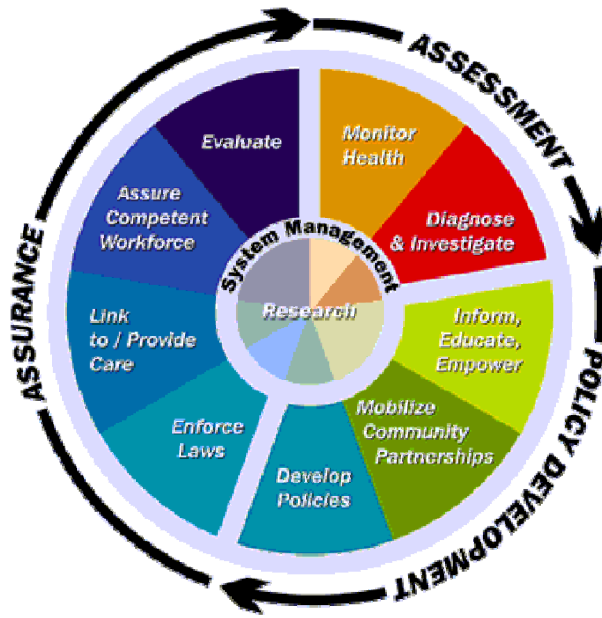

Program Description

The KU School of Medicine-Wichita (KUSM-W), Dept. of PMPH coordinates CPH sessions in partnership with the KDHE Bureau of Local and Rural Health. The focus of the program is to provide training across the 10 essential services in public health which parallel the PHAB accreditation domains. The program utilizes a blended learning approach, incorporating on-line learning modules and on-site sessions. Each live session will consist of two days of on-site training. Two of these sessions will be targeted training held in conjunction with the Governor's Public Health Conference (April 18-19, 2011) and the Kansas Public Health Association Annual Conference (Week of September 20th). A third session will be held in July, and the final live meeting of the year will be limited to the graduation presentation of your final project (April 2012). All live sessions will be held in Wichita.

On-Line Learning

Between on-site sessions, students will complete approximately 100 hours of on-line learning through KS-TRAIN and homework assignments. A significant portion of the homework time will include the completion of a practice based project that is developed and chosen by the learner (individual or team) within the program guidelines. Each training module consists of readings, assessments, and practice-based applications designed to increase knowledge in a public health essential service area.

Program Expectations

Participants in the CPH Program will need to:

- Have access to high speed Internet to complete on-line training.
- Actively participate in all live and web-based sessions.
- Attend the Governor's Public Health Conference and the Kansas Public Health Association Conference.
- Participate in the development and presentation of a final practice-based public health project
- Present final project at the 2012 Governor's Public Health Conference poster session.

Admission Requirements

There are no academic prerequisites for the program. Preference will be given to state and county public health employees. **The application deadline is November 19, 2010.** Applicants should visit the CPH Program website for instructions on how to complete the online application: www.waldcenter.org/cph

Program Costs

The cost of the program is \$750 per applicant. A limited number of scholarships for \$750 are available. Scholarships and financial support for the program are provided by the Kansas Health Foundation through KALHD and the Heartland Centers for Public Health and Community Development. Registration costs for the two public health conferences are not included in program tuition, and will be the individual's responsibility. However, specially discounted registration for each of the public health conferences will be available to CPH participants.

Continuing Education Credit

Continuing education credits will be offered for three of the two-day, on-site live sessions. CPH Program graduates can also receive KU-MPH credit.
